Presenting the 2018 Budget: Speaking for the Trustees, Ann Bodnyk reviewed the 2018 Budget, approved by Trustees at their January 28, 2018 meeting. This budget reflects the reality that the Meeting has 53 members, a loss of 6 since last year. It includes funds to improve safety at the Meetinghouse with the installation of panic bars and Exit lights. There are no funds for food for the Opportunity House suppers since we no longer sponsor that service project. Several Friends asked about the status and function of restricted

funds. Along with her answer Ann said she appreciated inquiries and wanted our Meeting financial records to be as transparent as possible.

Caln Quarter Meets February 18 Lancaster Meeting will host Caln Quarter's winter meeting. This is a daylong meeting beginning at 10am and ending at 3pm. The afternoon program will be a play about Benjamin Lay, followed by a Q&A period.


# **Exeter Meeting News**



# A TRIBUTE to my mom, **Charmoine Catherine Mary Schartel Jones** in the light of her connections to Reading Friends.

We, as a family, started attending the Reading Friends when I was 6 years old, that would have

been 1953 or 1954. My mother very soon started working with the little ones in the back of the meeting house. My dad was soon asked to lead the adult discussion group before meeting. During that time some people didn't even know they were married to each other, since my mother was never able to go to meeting. She felt it was important for the children to have consistency.

So, she taught every week for 6 years. My mother had many stories of the little children, happy ones and those that were sad and missed their mom and dad and


how she would rock them in the rocking chair, until they felt comforted. She remembered that she sang a song she made up in the moment which was very soothing.

She also was very involved with hospitality. Hazelette Hoopes told her she should be the clerk. Those of you who remember Hazelette probably can picture that. At that time Monthly Meeting was on a Friday night and there was a supper before the meeting. My mother would tell me stories of those suppers. For example, someone who was meant to cook wasn't able to show up. My mom was able to throw together a really good meal in a jiffy! She worked really had in everything she did.

One of her greatest gifts was her LOVE. Her heart was so huge for everyone, and she always was available to help where ever needed. How many times has she given a foot massage to someone in the moment when they needed it? How many hours of prayer did she spend praying for people? Her prayers were powerful! She was such an inspiration to so many people from baby to 100+ years old.

She is now certainly surrounded by her friends, Trine Liv Weyman, Olive Irwin, Janet Norton, Charlotte Irwin Jewel, B.J. Stillwell, Darl Hoopes, and of course, Curtis Jones and many others, as they re-
